SusHouse is a European research project concerned with developing and evaluating scenarios for transitions to sustainable households. It focuses on 'Shopping, Cooking and Eating', 'Clothing Care' and 'Shelter'. The project was carried out by six research teams from five countries - Germany, Hungary, Italy, the Netherlands and the United Kingdom - from January 1998 to June 2000. It was funded by the European Union (Environment and Climate Research Programme Theme 4: on Human Dimensions of Environmental Change, ENV4-CT97-0446).

HOW TO RUN THE SUSHOUSE SCENARIOS SLIDE SHOW:

•The folder called 'Scenario Show' contains a PC/MAC Powerpoint slideshow: "sshow.pps"

•To run the full version of the slideshow, you need a minimum of 250mb ram with Powerpoint 97 software and sound

To start the Scenario Show:

- 1) Open the folder "Scenario Show".
 - 2) Click the file "SSHOW.PPS", which automatically starts the Scenario Show
- if you have not enough ram memory on your computer, open the folder "light", and then click the file "LIGHT.PPS", which is a 'lighter' version of the show with less animation and sound.
 - if you still have memory problems with your computer, you can review the separate powerpoint slides using "LIGHT.PPT" (which is also in the folder "light")
 - the folder "PPVIS97P" contains powerpoint viewer, which pc users may install if they do not have Powerpoint 97 (click the file "PPVIS97.EXE").

HOW TO USE THE SUSHOUSE RESEARCH REPORTS DIRECTORY:

The folder called 'Research Reports' contains all the reports from the SusHouse project(both the full and the summary reports).To read these reports, you have to have acrobat reader installed on your computer. A free download can be obtained at www.adobe.com (click on 'get acrobat reader').

To Look At A Research Report:

1) Open the folder 'Research Reports'. 2) Open the file 'welcome.htm' 3) Click the button 'documents' on the left of the screen. This opens a matrix that gives access to all the reports. In this matrix, the reports are organised by methodological 'task', by household 'function' and by each of the five countries studied. 4) All icons in the matrix represent a report. Move the mouse-pointer across the icons to reveal the titles of the reports. Click an icon to open a particular document.

You can also view the reports without using the search-matrix: to do this you have to: 1) Open the folder 'Research Reports' 2) Explore the folder 'Projectreports'.

The matrix contains the following SusHouse research reports:

- The Full Project Report: this gives an overview of the complete SusHouse project, its methodology and its results (in a Full Report and a Summary Report). This Report can be found under the two top left icons.
- Three Functional Reports, which give an overview of the SusHouse research on (a) Shopping, Cooking & Eating, (b) Clothing Care, and (c) Shelter (full reports and summary reports). These reports are represented by the top row of icons.
- Five separate Task Reports, covering the different research methodologies that have been used in the SusHouse Project: (a) Workshop organisation & Stakeholder management, (b) Scenario-Construction, (c) Environmental Assessment, (d) Economic Analysis, (e) Consumers' Acceptance Analysis (full reports and summary reports). These reports are in the first column of icons.
- Nine Research Reports, each describing the complete SusHouse research for one Function in one country (full reports and summary reports). These reports are represented by the second row of icons.
- One overall Scenario Report (in three parts) and nine separate Scenario Reports, describing the scenarios that have been developed for each Function in the particular countries. These reports can be found in the fifth row of icons.
- Task Summaries, each describing one particular part of the SusHouse methodology as it was carried out for a particular Function in a particular country. These reports can be found in the other rows (rows 3,4,6,7,8).
